As Maryville citizens and voters we are asked invest in our community through the renewal of the Capital Improvement Sales Tax.

One of the primary drivers for community success and growth is quality of life. Communities that reinvest in infrastructure and amenities are communities that find success.

Maryville and Nodaway County have invested in infrastructure and amenities and now we have the opportunity to renew an infrastructure sales tax that has helped transform portions of the community.

This sales tax partially paid for the 4th Street, paving of South Munn, numerous trails, asphalt mill and overlay and the reconstruction of Main Street (1st to Halsey).

This tax is up for renewal and if passed will upgrade our public safety facility, asphalt mill and overlay eleven miles and will redevelop South Main (Phase 1).

Reinvestment in our community in both infrastructure and amenities makes a community more attractive to new residents and to companies.

As companies consider investing in a community there are several key components to their decision including labor force skill and availability and local infrastructure.

Nodaway County Economic Development supports the growth and development Maryville, to this end we support the renewal of the Capital Improvement Sales Tax.
